Our community is the fastest growing regional community in NSW.

I know that people across the electorate are doing it tough right now.

For our community to thrive, we need continued investment in education, health, housing and the essential infrastructure. Paying our essential workers fairly, the people who deliver these services, is a priority.

The \$65 million upgrade to Gillieston Public School is progressing well. It will see the residents of Gillieston Heights get the quality public school they deserve and includes a public preschool. Excitingly, Tenambit Public School which has been undergoing renovations, will have a new public preschool added as part of the biggest expansion of public preschools in NSW history.

We know that the provision of quality mental health services is vital and the Maitland Integrated Community Health and Mental Health Service will see the consolidation of our community health and mental health services onto one site.

Getting into to see your doctor has never been harder, so I welcome the Government's historic payroll tax incentives to encourage 70% bulk billing rates by regional GPs. This will be a great opportunity for Maitland residents to get access to more affordable health care from their GPs, and free up our emergency department.

I was also pleased to see more funding allocated to the \$22 million community health and community mental health facility which has been planned for East Maitland at the new hospital.

This budget also saw vital investment in road and water infrastructure, including new water connections to the growing western areas as well as more funding for the continuing planning for the duplication of the Thornton Rail Bridge. The NSW Government is also investing more funding in the raising of the Melville Ford Bridge to make it more flood resistant.

Across the Hunter, there is approximately \$3.5 billion in road projects under construction, many of which have been in the pipeline for decades. These upgrades include the M1 to Raymond Terrace, Hexham Straight Widening, the Singleton and Muswellbrook Bypasses and Rankin Park to Jesmond upgrades. These massive road and infrastructure projects will help everyone in Maitland by reducing the commute for work, education and medical care, as well as increasing employment opportunities.

My priority, each and every day, is to see the community of Maitland thrive.

M1 Extension

You can't miss the work underway at the missing M1 link.

The \$2.1 billion M1 extension, which includes upgrades to the surrounding network, such as the Hexham Straight widening, is funded by both the federal and state governments.

It will feature a 15-kilometre extension of the motorway, removing five sets of traffic lights and cutting nine minutes from travel times during peak periods.

The M1 extension at Raymond Terrace is expected to be open to traffic in 2028.

Redevelopment of Gillieston Public School & New Preschools

The \$65 million redevelopment of Gillieston Public School is progressing well. In addition to the nearly \$3 million in this year's budget for planning and the recent submission of the pre-development application, the project is even closer.

With the redevelopment of Gillieston Public School and Tenambit Public School, the NSW Government will deliver two new co-located pre-schools - one at each site. This will be a great benefit for families and help their pre-schoolers in the transition to primary in later years.

The NSW Government is committed to upgrading schools infrastructure across our state with better planning processes for new school upgrades and our ongoing school maintenance blitz.

Thornton Rail Bridge Duplication and Melville Ford

The NSW Government is delivering on its commitment to get Maitland moving again by investing \$15 million into the next stage of the Thornton Rail Bridge Duplication.

This kicks off initial works and planning. When delivered, the project will ease congestion and expand access to Thornton Road which offers a flood-free route for local residents during natural disasters.
